Call for Student Charter Trustee Nominations

The Nominating Committee of the Board of Trustees is now accepting nominations to fill an open Student Charter Trustee seat for a six-year term beginning July 1, 2023. All new Trustees will be elected by the full Board of Trustees at their meeting on June 22, 2023.

The Nominating Committee of the Board of Trustees considers many factors when evaluating a possible new Student Charter Trustee. These include all aspects of a student's experiences as well as the diversity and demographics of the board. Student Charter Trustees must be willing to attend board meetings, serve on board committees, and become actively involved in the life of the University. Consideration will be given to personal, academic, and leadership skills. Specifically, the Nominating Committee seeks candidates who are able and willing to assume the responsibilities of trusteeship that include, but are not limited to:

- Commitment of time and talent
- Attendance at and participation in board and committee meetings both as a student and after graduation
- Involvement in the life of the University
- Consideration of university-wide perspectives on issues and concerns
- Service as an ambassador for the University
- Exuberance in promoting the University's mission
- Recognition of the University's achievements and contributions to the public good

To be considered eligible, nominees must:

- be registered as a full-time undergraduate or graduate student, who will have completed a minimum of two full years of undergraduate study or one full year of graduate study at Rutgers University at the time of election (June 22, 2023)
- be in good academic, judicial, and financial standing
- demonstrate academic achievement with a "B" average or equivalent
- demonstrate engagement in the life of the University
- demonstrate co-curricular achievements and service to the University Community
- have the ability and a commitment to attend meetings throughout the entire six-year term
- avoid any conflict of interest
- have the ability and a commitment to attend university events and programs throughout the entire six-year term
 - University Policy <u>50.1.12</u> stipulates that board members must avoid any conflict of interest or the appearance of a conflict of interest consistent with New Jersey law. Students may not be employed or compensated for service by the University during their term as a Trustee.
